



National Public Works Week 2017 CPWA Awards

Purpose

The CPWA National Public Works Week Awards were established to promote excellence in National Public Works Week (NPWW) public outreach by recognizing municipalities for their NPWW programs and events. 2017 is Canada's 150th anniversary, so there is even more cause for celebration.

Awards are given in four categories:

- **First Time Entry:** Any community submitting for the first time
- **Small Centre:** Populations 75,000 or less
- **Medium Centre:** Populations 75,001 - 250,000
- **Large/Metro Centre:** Populations 250,001 or more

Eligibility

Any municipality in Canada is eligible for nomination.

Selection

Criteria to be used in the selection process include:

- Public Outreach (25%) – the range or scale of people engaged.
- Education (25%) – the inclusion of an education component(s).
- Events Held (15%) – the number of days NPWW events were held.
- Staff Involvement (15%) – the level of participation by Public Works staff and union personnel.
- Political Involvement (10%) – the level of political presence in the NPWW activities.
- Charity Events (5%) – the inclusion of a charitable event(s) and the level of volunteer effort involved.
- Creativity (5%)

The CPWA National Public Works Week Awards Evaluation Committee reviews the nominations and selects the award winners.

Nomination Process

Nominations can be made by the managing public agency or municipality. Please refer to the Nomination and Supporting Data Form for more details.

Deadline

June 16, 2017 (electronic submittals only)

Presentation

A designated representative of the public agency or municipality is presented a plaque at the municipal event of their choice (usually a town council meeting) and winners are announced at the CPWA Luncheon at PWX and in APWA publications.
